## **Program Overview & Highlights**

This course focuses on the current British TV and Cinema industry. Participants will meet with faculty and students in the Department of Film Studies at Oxford Brookes University, our film studies exchange partner (beginning in Fall 2012) and will tour many of Britain's leading media production facilities and museums. These will include the BBC, ITV, Pinewood Studios, the British Film Institute and The Centre for Film and Visual Media.

Students will also experience British history through tours of Oxford, Bath and London.



## **Course Activities & Itinerary**

**Pre-travel Class Meeting: TBA** 

Tues., June 12: Depart from Springfield airport; arrive in Oxford, England

Wed., June 13: Tour Oxford; meet with Oxford Brookes Film Studies faculty

Thurs., June 14: Daytrip to London - tour of the BBC and Warner Brothers Studio

Fri., June 15: Tour of Oxford film sites, Ashmolean Museum of Natural History and Blenheim Castle, Winston Churchill's home

Sat., June 16: Daytrip to Bath - tour an inspirational location for film producers, actors and authors. Bath has been the site of some big-name productions, including Dracula, The Duchess, Persuasion and Vanity Fair, and has attracted stars such as Judi Dench, Kiera Knightley and Reese Witherspoon. Bath's major sites — Pulteney Bridge (pictured above), the Circus and the Royal Crescent — will provide a fascinating insight into how Bath became the world-class attraction it is today.

Sun., June 17: London - tour of famous landmarks including Westminster Abbey, the Tower of London and the Royal Palace.

Mon, June 18: Guided walking tour of London's famous film locations (Bridget Jones's Diary, The Da Vinci Code, Four Weddings and a Funeral, Harry Potter, Mona Lisa, Sherlock Holmes, and many more), TV and film studios (including Pinewood Studios) and museums (British Film Institute, TV Centre for Film and Visual Media).

We'll also see ancient streets, pubs, churches and other places of historical interest, taking in the River Thames, The Strand, Fleet Street and into the City of London.

Tues., June 19: Tour Stratford-upon-Avon (Shakespeare's home)

Wed., June 20: Day trip to the Cotwalds and Stonehenge

Thurs., June 21: Free time in Oxford

Fri., June 22: Depart Oxford for Springfield

### **Course Credit & Requirements**

Pending satisfactory completion of required coursework, students will receive 3 hours of credit for MED 300.

**Required text(s):** Student will receive in advance a packet of readings on the contemporary British TV and film industry. This will serve as the foundation material for our tour.

Assessment of Learning: Students will be evaluated based on their participation, their comprehension of reading materials, and their ability to incorporate the field experience from the program into a final paper.

After returning to the U.S., each student will submit a 15-page paper summarizing the materials in their packets and incorporating additional information about the British TV and film industry gathered during the study tour.

## **Application & Payment**

Missouri State University students who are approved by the Program Director may apply. Instructions are included on the program application.

A non-refundable deposit of \$545 will be billed to your student account upon application (due by Jan. 20, 2012). Airfare (\$1,400) will be billed Feb. 17, 2012, and the balance of program costs (\$1,693) will be billed to your account on May 11, 2012.

The published program cost is based on rates in effect on the publication date of this flyer and may be subject to change.

Program participants agree to a potential increase of up to 10% in the program fee if costs increase before or during travel.

#### **Cancellation & Refund Policies**

- If a student withdraws prior to April 30, 2012, a full refund will be made, less the \$545 deposit and non-refundable purchases made on behalf of the student.
- If a student is forced to withdraw from the program after April 30, 2012, for a bona fide medical reason, a full refund of all payments will be made, less the \$545 deposit and expenses. A certificate of incapacitating illness or injury from a licensed physician is necessary in making claims for refund.
- Students withdrawing voluntarily after April 30, 2012, or withdrawing due to medical reasons not protected under the fees refund policy, receive no refund.
- Once the program has started, students withdrawing receive no refund under any circumstances.
- All notifications of withdrawal must be made in writing and sent to the Program Director and to Elizabeth Strong at the Study Away Office, Jim D. Morris Center, Suite 403. Non-payment of fees does not guarantee automatic withdrawal.
- Any plans by a participant not to travel and return with the group must also be submitted in writing to the Program Director and the Study Away Office.
- The tour may be cancelled if enrollment is fewer than 10 participants. In this event, students will receive a refund of all fees.

#### **Voucher Eligibility & Financial Aid**

If you entered MSU as a freshman in 2009 or 2010, you may use the **Study Away \$500 voucher**. Students who receive financial aid through MSU may apply that aid to the program, if eligible. Contact the Office of Financial Aid at **836-5262** for more information.
