Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's degree in music
- Intermediate English proficiency (self-reported)

Master of Music at Missouri State University

Upon successful completion of the English for Musicians program, students will meet the English proficiency requirement for admission to the Master of Music Program at MSU, which means they **will not need a TOEFL score**.

The Master of Music degree offers the following concentrations: Composition; Conducting (Choral, Wind, or Orchestral); Music Education; Pedagogy (the science of teaching an instrument); and Performance.

Facilities

Missouri State University is home to state-of-theart performance halls, rehearsal and practice facilities, classrooms, and recording studios. Three buildings on the MSU campus are dedicated to music:

Juanita K. Hammons Hall (pictured): This beautiful 2,220 seat performing arts center is one of the best in the region and features visiting artist recitals, the Springfield Symphony, and off-Broadway shows.

Ellis Hall: Ellis is home to the Music Department and includes a recital hall with a pipe organ, practice rooms, a 17-station piano lab classroom, and a Music Library featuring student access to audio media technology.

Wehr Band Hall: The band hall features rehearsal rooms, faculty offices, and a recording studio.

Visa: F-1 visa documents are provided. Visa and SEVIS fees are not included in program prices.







