Course Name: **Neotropical Bat Ecology: Nicaragua**

Course Number: BIO 527/627

Credit Hours: **3** undergraduate/graduate

Course Overview & Objectives:

This course is designed to give students hands on experience with ecological topics such as capture and handling, population and habitat studies, and conservation of a wide range of neotropical bat species. This will involve two weeks of work at the Maderas Rainforest Conservancy on Ometepe Island, Nicaragua. This is an area of high conservation and biodiversity concern. Activities will include netting of bat species, small mammal trapping, participation in conservation education and learning about the local culture and ecosystems as well as conducting, compiling and presenting field research.

Rabies pre-exposure vaccine is required but will be supplied by the university at Taylor Health and Wellness. The 3 shot series must be started at least a month prior to departure.

Program Fee: \$3,235

Program Fee Includes: Round-trip airfare, lodging, conference registration fee, most meals, Study Away student fee, basic medical insurance, and access to private and/or public beaches; separated costs not available.

Program Fee Excludes: Passport, ground transportation in Springfield, some meals, incidentals/misc personal expenses, and souvenirs. \$612/741 MSU tuition for 3 hours of undergraduate/graduate credit. Both Missouri residents and non-residents pay the Mo. resident per-credit-hour tuition rate, per University policy.

Applications are due by January 20, 2014.

Course Schedule & Itinerary

PRE-TRAVEL MEETINGS

February 5, 2014: Review syllabus, check passport and travel needs. Brief introduction to bats and bat handling.

March 19, 2014: Get to know each other, passport and travel requirements check. Go over itinerary, conservation of bats, and culture of Nicaragua.

April 30, 2014: Learn how to capture, handle, and itentify neotropical bats.

STUDY TOUR

May 18, 2014: Depart Springfield for Managua. Lodging in Best Western.

May 19, 2014: Transfer to Ometepe Island, Maderas Rainforest Conservancy.

May 19-29, 2014: Field studies at Maderas Rainforest Conservancy and other local areas. Daily lectures and nightly netting.

May 30, 2014: Transfer to Granada, stopping at an active volcano and a cave in which bats roost.

May 31, 2014: Transfer to Managua for overnight lodging.

June 1, 2014: Depart Managua for Springfield.

POST-TRAVEL

Students will present their findings of field research in a PowerPoint presentation.

Course Credit & Requirements

Students will be graded based upon the requirements below.

a) 2 examinations will be conducted while in the field. The first will cover species captured while the second will be short answer/essay questions in regards to the daily lecture component.

b) In regards to this, students will be expected to keep a species check list and a detailed field journal, noting biological, ecological, and conservation observations made during each field excursion.

c) Each student will work in a groups of two to three to answer an ecological question. This will include conducting research and a review of the pertinent literature on that topic.

d) A written research report will be conducted (1 per group) and turned in at the meeting following the trip. At this time, an oral presentation of the research findings will also be conducted by the group.

Application & Payment Procedures

Visiting Students: A non-refundable deposit of \$485 (check or money order) must accompany your application (deadline Jan. 20, 2014). A check or money order for the balance of the program fee (\$2,750) and MSU course tuition (\$621/741) will be due by April 21, 2014.
